3) UPDATE ON MEASURES: The CCLC Collaborative will no longer be using Optional Measure 12, which was “Microalbuminuria screening in past year.” The original measures for the CCLC Collaborative were based on the measures of the Health Disparities Collaborative. However, a very observant Collaborative member pointed out that there is an inherent problem with this measure because once a person has macroalbumin (proteinuria) OR has microalbumin twice, there is no indication for ongoing testing as they are already positive. Further research revealed that the way ACE/ARB is being measured in the Health Disparities Collaborative for 2005 has changed. There is no longer a microalbuminuria measure anymore because of recent evidence from the HOPE trial that basically anyone over the age of 55 with diabetes should be on an ACE or ARB, no matter what their microalbumin is. For these teams who chose this optional measure, Angela Hovis, CCLC Improvement Advisor, will contact you shortly to modify your graphing template to reflect this change.
